Year-end gifts and ongoing prayers sought

Lauryn is 18 years old. She grew up in Dowagiac, MI, and lived with her mom and twin brothers. She started smoking and drinking at the age of 12, and turned to meth at the age of 16. Lauryn attended Dowagiac High School until 10th grade, but she lost her motivation to graduate and dropped out of school. She was arrested at 17 and spent two days in jail.

Lauryn learned about Wings of God from a former resident and

decided to explore our program. She didn't know about God before coming here on January 4, 2018. When Lauryn was younger, she only attended church a handful of times, and that was her only exposure to God. She didn't know about recovery or how to live a different life. When she entered our doors, she was broken and scared, but soon began to learn about how God could change her life.

After turning herself in to her probation officer, she was sentenced to 30 days on a tether. Though the devastation was deep in her heart for returning to her old ways, Lauryn returned to Wings of God on February 6, 2018.

Lauryn shares, "It was the best decision I ever made. I would still be spiritually dead and I did not want to live a life without God. I love that I now have a relationship with Jesus and I am happy and have joy in my heart. I have a life that is worth living. Wings of God got me back on my feet and without this program, I wouldn't have a relationship with God. Wings of God saved my life."

Lauryn was moved by the Holy Spirit and cried tears of joy as she recalled how much God has changed her life. She said, "He made me a warrior. I want the donors to know that I appreciate



everything they do for us. Without them, the changes in my life would not be possible." Lauryn received her GED while at the Wings of God. She attends Freshwater Church and works part time for Chicken Coop in Paw Paw. She is currently enrolled in KVCC and plans to get her degree in nursing to become a traveling nurse.

This is only part of Lauryn's story. As you can see, God has

begun and will continue to rewrite her story into a beautiful example of redemption and restoration.

As this year comes to an end and we enter into a season of giving, please consider a year-end gift to the Wings of God. Meet a WOG House Pearl: Monica

onica grew up on a farm in Cedar, MI (near Traverse City), and was raised by her father. Her mother left the family when Monica was young. Her mother passed away at the age of 51 as a result of alcoholism and her father died at the age of 52 as a result of a four-wheeling accident.

As a child, Monica was chiefly responsible for doing chores on the farm. She did a lot of normal things such as riding snowmobiles, dirt bikes and four-wheelers. However, she said, "I always felt emptiness and that I wasn't good enough." At age 13, she began looking for acceptance and love by hanging out with socially unhealthy friends and started drinking and smoking marijuana. Her legal trouble, which also started at age 13. ended with her spending a year in jail at the age of 17. During that jail stay, she felt incredibly alone. Monica turned 18 in jail; she missed Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years and had only one visit from her father during the entire year.

After being released from jail, she became pregnant with her first son, Anthony. His father left her when she was three months pregnant. During her pregnancy, she worked full-time and was introduced to her husband, Lucas, the father of her second son, Noah. She enjoyed living a normal life and being a wife for 10 years until her husband died at the age of 27. Her addiction and criminal behavior rekindled after his death. She left her two children in the care of her older sister and started using and participating in criminal behavior. She was sentenced to Drug Court in Kalamazoo, but ran from that program and became pregnant with her third son, Jaden. During her third pregnancy, she stayed with the family of a local church she was attending. She was going through the motions of being clean and living a normal life; however, she had not completely surrendered to God.

Monica returned to active addiction, was arrested and became pregnant with her fourth child, a daughter, Heaven. Monica spent most of her fourth



pregnancy at KPEP in Kalamazoo. After completing their program, she relapsed causing

> her to lose parental rights to Javden and Heaven. The seeds were planted with Monica and she didn't stop trying to live a normal life. She became pregnant with her fifth child, Carter, who was born in 2017. Monica relapsed shortly thereafter and wound up in a mental hospital. It was there that she realized her mental condition played a part in her addiction and that she needed God. Monica remembered hearing about the Wings of God program during one of her stays at

celebrated six months clean on December 11th.

Monica currently works part-time and is a key holder for a local auto parts store. She is currently the Resident Assistant at Wings of God as a result of her leadership skills. She stated, "My relationship with God is more personal since being at the Wings of God. I am learning how to seek Him first and I am able to hear His message: 'You are loved, You are worth it and everything is going to get better.' I am learning how to have patience and let go of instant gratification. It is a slow process; even the snail persevered and made it to the Ark. God has not given up on me. I believe people do care about me. If you are thinking about becoming a resident, this place will change your life." Monica plans to spend the next six months working and saving to buy a car, finding an apartment in Paw Paw, signing up for school and rebuilding relationships with her children.
